AUSTRIAN INTERNATIONAL SHOTOKAN CHAMPIONSHIP 2018

Location: Attergauer Freizeitzentrum 4880 St.Georgen im Attergau, Pausingergasse 26 How to get there: motorway A1 Vienna - Salzburg, exit St. Georgen im Attergau Saturday, 05th of May, 2018, Date: check-in opens at 8.00 Uhr, competitions start at 9 a.m. until Thursday, 03rd of May, 2018 available online: www.sportdata.org Draw: Competitions: Kata & Kumite (ESKA Competition Rules) Category Kata and Kumite (individual and team): YOUTH LADIES – YOUTH MEN (aged 14-15) CADET LADIES – CADET MEN (aged 16-17) JUNIOR LADIES – JUNIOR MEN (aged 16-20) SENIOR LADIES – SENIOR MEN (KATA aged 16 and older; KUMITE aged 18 and older) Additional competitions Kata individual & team (male and female) U10, U12, U14, U16B Kata Individual B, Kata Individual 35+ (minimum age) (ESKA competition rules with certain adjustments) Limits: Kata Individual Category B: 4th Kyu and below Additionally, there are no other limits in Kata. However, Kata must be performed according to the rules (see "rules Kata"). Authorization: Austrian athletes must be registered with a ÖKB club and the club mustn't have any outstanding debts. Athletes must have a valid ÖKB-member card with a valid stamp, a physical examination certificate (including date and doctor's signature), an Austrian passport or ID-card ("Personalausweis") and a certificate of registration. Those documents must be handed in at the check-in counter or uploaded on MYDOJO.

> All international athletes, who are registered with an approved international Karate club (EKF, WKF or ESKA), are allowed to participate in this championship. A valid member card must be shown at check-in.

Age groups:reference date for all age groups is the 23rd of November, 2018ESKA European Championship 2018

Kata Rules: ESKA Competition Rules with certain adjustments for U10 – U16B:

Individual competitions:

In the preliminary rounds of the contest (more than 8 competitors), the main referee announces the kata (see list of katas) and the two competitors have to perform kata **at the same time** (standing next to each other). The referees then use the flags to announce the winner.

Rounds with 8 competitors (and fewer): Each competitor chooses a kata from the list of katas and the referees use points to assess the performance. The four competitors with the highest score then reach the final round of the contest. In the finale, competitors can perform a kata of their choice.

List of Katas:

<u>U 10, U 12, U 14, U 16 B, Female B und Male B :</u> more than 8 competitors: Taikyoku 1, Heian 1–3

8 competitors and fewer – referees assess performance using points; athletes can choose their kata: **Taikyoku 1, Heian 1–5**

Finale (4 competitors): competitors can perform a Shotokan kata of their choice– however, it <u>mustn't</u> be the kata which was last performed!

YOUTH, CADET, JUNIOR, SENIOR and Kata Individual +35:

16 competitors and more:	Heian 2 – 5,
16 to 8 competitors:	Jion, Kanku Dai, Bassai Dai, Enpi

8 competitors and fewer – referees use points to assess performance: Jion, Kanku Dai, Bassai Dai, Enpi, Hangetsu

Finale (4 competitors): competitors can perform a Shotokan kata of their choice– however, it <u>mustn't</u> be the kata which was last performed!

Team competitions:

Referees use points to assess the performance of each team. If there are more than 4 teams, there will be preliminary rounds. In the final round (4 teams), teams must perform a different kata than in the preliminary round. No Bunkai.

rules Kumite: ESKA –Competition Rules (Shobu Ippon)

protective gear (according to ESKA rules):

Obligatory: white Kumite gloves, gumshield, jockstrap for male competitors as well as breast protector for female competitors. Shin guards are prohibited.!

belt Shiro (white) and Aka (red)

Coaches have to wear a tracksuit during the competition.

Athletes, who have won a medal, have to wear a Karategi or a tracksuit during the medal ceremony.
